Fighting for Breeders: Our Advocacy Efforts

In June last year, we updated members on our efforts to secure a seat on the National Horse Traceability Implementation Task Force. Unfortunately, we are still in the same position—breeders continue to be left out of critical discussions that directly impact them. The reality is, we are being overlooked—but that won't stop us. AHBF continues to push for a seat at the table.

Instead of waiting for recognition, we are strengthening



our network, expanding breeder and breed organisation support, and using industry insights to drive real change.

Breeding Sector Deserves Funding-Let's Make It Happen


The racing and performance sectors secure millions in government funding, annually, yet breeders and breed organisations—who sustain the entire industry—receive nothing.

- Ongoing Fundraising Initiatives Expanding efforts like the stallion raffle to create sustainable funding
